December 25 (Christmas)



In recent days we have seen even

worship, were the targets. Our hearts

break every time we hear about these random acts of violence. In the world in which we live, there are steps we should take, no matter where we are, to make ourselves as safe as we can be. I don't know that we'll ever be able to stop these kinds of vicious acts - but there are things we can do without living our lives in fear.

First of all, be aware of the people around you. If you are at church and you see someone you don't recognize, introduce yourself and initiate a conversation. If you have suspicions about the person, report it to the church office. We want to be welcoming, but we also want people to be safe.

Second, take a moment the next time you are at church and locate the exits in the areas you tend to frequent. How would you get out if something happened? Our teachers have been trained on emergency evacuation routes, so if you have a child in Sunday School, they will exit with their class. Know *your* exit route.

And lastly, our teachers have been trained using the "Run.Hide.Fight" policy. You may view a training video by doing a google search of Run. Hide. Fight. It is a common sense approach to an active shooter situation. First - get out. Call 911 as soon as you can safely do so. Second - if you can't get out, Hide. Where is the nearest room with a door that locks? Barricade the door if possible. Silence your cell phone. Third - be prepared to fight back if necessary.

Our Buildings and Grounds committee will be talking about this issue at future meetings and may make some security recommendations to the Session. But I hope you will prepare yourself with these simple suggestions so you know what you would do in the event of an emergency.

In response to the shooting at the church in Texas, below is a link to a video produced by the FBI: "Run Hide Fight" dramatizing an active shooter situation to provide instruction about how to survive. Warning: this is a very realistic, disturbing but very effective video. It portrays a gunman shooting people and what it would be like to be caught in this situation. As we struggle to accept the reality of this phenomenon, it's important to be prepared and have a plan. First Presbyterian would follow this process in the event of such an event.

We will be decorating the church halls for Advent on December 2 starting at 9:30 a.m. All ages and abilities are needed.


We have trees to decorate, wreaths to hang, and poinsettias to put out. We will have some light refreshments to keep us going.

Happy, Healthy Holidays

Smith-Mathers report poor living conditions in Juba

Nancy Smith-Mather, mission co-worker with her husband, Shelvis, in South Africa, writes that she feels overwhelmed by the amount of suffering around them. Recently she visited a displaced persons camp in Juba and reports the conditions in the camp were horrible. Five functioning pit latrines serve for over 7000 people. Ten other latrines were locked up, not useable, overflowing into a pool of waste There is hunger and no schools for the children.

Yet a grandfather sat reading his Bible under a tarp overhang and a grandmother proclaimed, "Even though we are living in a hard situation here in Juba, God who created us did not leave us." Their faith was sustaining them.

Nancy's request was

"May the larger church body lift them up in prayer, as they requested. Let us labor for their nation to find peace so people can return home and cultivate their land. And in the present time, let us not grow tired of supporting their physical needs."
