



# First Presbyterian Church celebrates 158th anniversary, recognizes 50<sup>+</sup>-year members

The First Presbyterian Church of Rochester was founded on February 17, 1861, by Sheldon Jackson. Since then we have traveled the roads of 158 years. Some of these roads have been rough, some smooth, some straight, some winding, but each one has helped reveal to us the love of God working through our lives.

On February 17 we will honor and say "thank you" to 92 "golden" people who have been members for at least 50 years. Their names have been in our bulletins and newsletters as Sunday School teachers, ushers, choir members, stewardship campaign workers, elders, and deacons. Many of them still appear on the church's doorstep regularly as volunteers.

Our most senior member, Ursula Thedens, was confirmed at First Presbyterian in 1942. Our oldest "golden," Margaret Harris, joined in 1951. Our youngest "golden," David Smyrk, was confirmed in 1968.

## Can you help?

In June, First Presbyterian Church is planning to send a mission team to the Bdecan Presbyterian Church in Tokio, North Dakota for the fifth year. While there the team will provide Vacation Bible School for the children on the Spirit Lake Reservation.

In preparation for the trip, there are two projects you can help with:

Are you a sewer? The team would like to take 35 cloth bags for the students to store their VBS papers and projects. Later the children can use them for school. At February circle meetings the team provided the pre-cut cloth pieces and instructions on how to sew the bags together.

Do you prefer to shop? The second project is hygiene bags for the children who are sent to residential school without soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, shampoo, etc. The team wants to provide each child with a bag of products just for them. At the February circle meetings the team will provide a list of needed supplies and a plastic bag to put them in. You can shop individually or pair up with a friend.



# Financial Fitne\$\$: giving is good for your heart



At its January meeting Session adopted a budget of \$827,250 for 2019. This is a 3.9% (\$30,924) increase over the 2018 budget. The increase was driven primarily by 2.7% across the board staff raises, and allowances for search committee expenses and the celebration dinner.

The budget will be underwritten by general budget and outreach pledges (\$711,959), supplemental pledges (29,838) (thank you), one-time gifts (\$18,538), contributions over pledge (\$42,000), plate offering (\$10,000), miscellaneous income (\$7,000), and interest (\$1,000). We also included a faith factor of \$6,915.


