## Budget needs estimated at \$811,318; available funds reach \$793,707

Thank you for your response to our pledge campaign for 2018. Your responses have been supportive and we appreciate it. We just need more responses returned!

Including both general and outreach budget pledges and non-pledged income, as of December 17 we had \$793,707 committed for 2018. To fund committees' current budgets and allow for some growth we need about \$811,318, leaving a negative income gap of \$17,611.



January 2018

On December 10, I preached a sermon called "Merely Christian" in which I referred to the "Best Christian Book of All Time Tournament" conducted by the Emerging Scholars Network of Intervarsity Christian Fellowship.

You can find more details and a PDF of the tournament brackets by searching "Best Christian Books" at <a href="https://www.emergingscholars.org">www.emergingscholars.org</a>. Many of you expressed your appreciation for C.S. Lewis, whose *Mere Christianity* narrowly lost to Augustine's *Confessions*. So I thought I'd do a little more "bracketology" analysis.

As with the NCAA basketball tournament, 64 books were invited to the tournament (sorry, I have no idea about the bubble teams), organized into four brackets — Theology and Apologetics, Christian Life and Discipleship, Fiction and Poetry and Memoirs, Devotions and Spirituality. The voting was done by the Emerging Scholars Network on their Facebook page.

The top two seeds in each bracket included *Mere* Christianity and Calvin's *Institutes of Theology*; The Cost of Discipleship and The Divine Conspiracy in Christian Life; The Divine Comedy and Lord of the Rings in Fiction; and Confessions and The Imitation of Christ in Memoirs. A worthy field!

As with any March Madness Tournament, it's always interesting to see the upsets. In this tournament, major upsets included #13 On Christian Teaching by Augustine taking down #4 Letter from a Birmingham Jail by Martin Luther King Jr; #11 Revelations of Love by Julian of Norwich knocked out The Return of the Prodigal Son by Henri Nouwen; and sadly for us Presbyterians, #7 Summa Theologica by Thomas Aquinas upended #2 Calvin's Institutes!

The most votes were garnered by the matchup between The Chronicles of Narnia vs The Brothers Karamazov with 121 total votes cast. The biggest margin of victory was the drubbing that A Purpose Driven Life took at the hands of The Cost of Discipleship. The least amount of votes (54) was generated by the matchup of Revelations of Love and The Imitation of Christ, in which Imitation emerged victorious. The closest margin of victory came with a one-point win for Revelations of Love over The Return of the Prodigal Son, for one of the major upsets of the tournament.

In the end, *Confessions* beat *Mere Christianity* in the finals 50-43!

I personally would dispute that result. I would favor C.S. Lewis.

Oh well, just a bit of fun for those March Madness fans out there.

- Never to lose one moment of time.
- Never to do anything which I should despise or think meanly of in another.
- Never to do anything out of revenge.
- To let there be ... benevolence in all that I speak.

## Per Capita assessed at \$34.50 per member for 2018

As local church members, we have an obligation to support our higher judicatories. This per capita assessment supports overhead expenses of our church, including presbytery, synod, and general assembly.

The amount due each judicatory is set at the particular unit's meeting during the summer and is based on membership on December 31 of the previous year. Our membership on December 31, 2016 was 693. The assessment per active member includes \$21.37 for presbytery, \$5.40 for synod, and \$7.73 for general assembly.

Even if you choose to not pledge, we urge you to consider making a donation of at least \$34.50 per member to help us underwrite this budget item of \$23,908.50. Thank you!

## Pick up your pledge envelopes

Please pick up your pledge envelopes in the social hall by January 31. Envelopes are prepared for adults who contribute regularly (unless you told us you don't want envelopes or you use ACH), for new members, and for children (pre-kindergarten through senior high) who want them.

Because many of you don't use offering envelopes, we've cut down the number we order. If we inadvertently left your name off the envelope list, please let us know. It's actually more cost efficient for us if you use envelopes.

If there isn't a box with your name and you would like one, if you've never used envelopes and you'd like to, or if your children would like a box, we have extras and would be happy to give you one.

## Statements will be mailed second week in January

We will mail final statements for 2017 about January 9. The statement format will list each charitable eligible contribution made to First Presbyterian during 2017. For those who itemize deductions on their income tax return, this format meets the IRS requirement for substantiation of contributions.

## Using the church parking lot on weekdays

As a member of First Presbyterian Church, you may park in the church lot during the week. If you do, you need a church identification hang-tag on your rearview mirror. You may get a tag in the church office from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays.

Because of the continuing use of the lot by unauthorized people, we periodically ticket and/or tow cars that do not have the proper identification. You may use the lot during the week, but it is your responsibility to be sure your car is properly identified.

We lease out 18 spaces - all the north row and 6 marked spaces in the second row. Do not park there! When you are not on church business, please park your car on the west side of the lot and leave the area closest to the church for those who are at the church on church business.

There are occasions when we ask you to not park in the lot: when we expect a large gathering at the church, on third Wednesday mornings when Priscilla Circle meets, on Wednesdays during Lent unless you are attending the Lenten Organ Recitals, and when there's a funeral at the church. We appreciate your compliance with these requests. Thank you!

#### \* WEATHER ADVISORY \*

If we need to cancel services due to extreme weather conditions, we will send that announcement to KTTC-TV, KTTC.com, put it on our WEB page FPCRochester.org, put it on the church's answering machine, and, if possible, send you an e-mail. Whenever canceling is a possibility, please check these sources for up-to-date information.

#### \* SAFETY ADVISORY \*

In the coming winter season when conditions can create slippery walkways, we ask all members to be responsible and wear appropriate footwear made for snow and ice and choose the safest path from your car into the building. The staff aims to keep the church walks as clear of snow/ice as possible, but each of us must also do our part for safety by exercising caution and discretion. Here's to a safe winter season!

## Mission Committee reports on aftermath of hurricanes in Cuba

### **Jagúey Grande**

Our partner church at Jagúey Grande has a new pastor, Armando Guedes. The former pastor, Pastor Liz, is now serving the church at Union de Reyes. Jagúey Grande continues providing breakfast for elderly people. The congregation sends greetings and thanks for our help over the years. The church is having a problem with a leak in the roof which has caused damage in the activity room and office. Our mission committee sent \$500 to help with repairs.

#### Mission coworkers

David Cortes-Fuentes and Josey Saez, mission coworkers we support in Cuba, report that the hurricane in Cuba was worse than expected. At Matanzas Seminary, where they work, eighty percent of the trees and plants were demolished, including the vegetable garden, which serves the seminary, hospitals, and part of the city's population. Also damaged were the plumbing and water systems, some ceilings, part of the lighting and electrical system, and the paint on some of the buildings. The mission committee sent \$1000 for the needs of the seminary.

### Cuba at large

There is concern for the larger community. Cuba's fragile, poorly managed food and goods supply chain and distribution system, which contributes to chronic scarcity in every community, suffers even more. Yet the people of Cuba continue to live with and in hope. Keep them and all who suffered because of the hurricanes in your prayers.


