#### July 22, 2018 – 1 p.m. – Oxbow Park

Meet at Oxbow Park at 1 p.m. We will gather at the main picnic area and then explore part of the over 620 acres that make up this incredible Olmsted County Park. The park derived its name in reference to the meander of the river. Early settlers noted that the river bent almost on to itself, forming a near circle that reminded them of an oxen harness, or Oxbow. One "oxbow" has been preserved through bank stabilization and now surrounds the main picnic area." Please note that Olmsted County rules prohibit dogs on the trails.

#### August 26, 2018 – 1 p.m. – Essex Park

Meet at Essex Park (<u>5455 West River Road NW</u>) at 1 p.m. Come and enjoy this great green space that once was a farm in NW Rochester. It has plenty of nice walking trails to enjoy.

#### September 23, 2018 – 1 p.m. – College Street

We will start at the First Presbyterian Church parking lot. We will then check out part of historic Third Street, and take a walk to the early days of Rochester on College Street. Be sure to bring your imagination.


# Bdecan VBS team extends thanks to congregation

Teddy Roosevelt once said,
"Comparison is the thief of joy."
Comparing ourselves has always been a dangerous temptation; consider Cain and Abel, Jacob and Esau, or Rachel and Leah. Yet in our

social media age, it is harder to avoid than ever! There is always someone more attractive, more accomplished, smarter, wealthier, or happier than ourselves. As Proverbs14:30 (NIV) notes, "A heart at peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones." How do we avoid falling into what Dr. Sood, director of Mayo's Integrative Health and Medicine program, terms the "comparison trap?"

- 1. Focus on our own and others' intrinsic worth what God values, not what other people value
- 2. Celebrate others' accomplishments and do not allow jealousy to get in the way of learning from them
- Live positively and lovingly. "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." (1 Corinthians 13:7 [RSV])
- Give ourselves grace. We all have weaknesses that we need to know, confront - and forgive. We are flawed human, loved and redeemed by God's grace.

# PW Circles support national Birthday Offering

Circle members contributed \$1200 to the national Birthday Offering. The offering supports three projects, one of which is in our own Presbytery.

- The Dwelling Place, Minneapolis and St. Paul.

  The Dwelling Place was established in 1998 to provide for the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of women and their children following their escape from a violent partner. The grant will help them to purchase a vacant lot where they can construct a multi-use building. With this building they will be able to serve more women and children seeking safety.
- Cottage Village, Cottage Grove, Oregon. The grant will be used to help build 13 tiny houses which will provide affordable housing for individuals and families with very low incomes.
- Village of Grace Center for Physical and Spiritual Health, Tegucigalpa, Honduras. The grant will allow the Presbytery of Honduras to purchase this center, which will offer international hospitality for retreats, workshops, and mission teams.


