#### **Practice Sabbath in September**

had done in creation." (Genesis 2.3 [NRSV])



The school year and all associated activities start back up in September. Yet in this season of busyness, I encourage you to take time for Sabbath. God himself took a Sabbath

after the busy work of creating the world: "So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he

God considered it so important that he made honoring the Sabbath one of the Ten Commandments. By Jesus' times, observing the Sabbath had become legalistic and restrictive. Jesus broke with these customs by healing and allowing his disciples to harvest grain on the Sabbath, explaining to those who questioned, "The Sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the Sabbath." (Mark 2.27 [NRSV]).

So I challenge you to practice Sabbath this September. Think about it as grown-up recess. Studies have shown that more recess actually helps kids focus in school. Choose a day to be your "recess." Do whatever is more restful for you -hiking or journaling, cooking a thoughtful meal or eating out. Unplug - have a game night not a movie night and enjoy a real conversation. Take a nap.

#### FPC women attend Churchwide Gathering

The Churchwide Gathering of Presbyterian Women - a very diverse ethnic group - met in Louisville, Kentucky August 2-5. There were 1640 registrants plus 21 international guests and 4 ecumenical partners. The first plenary was opened with Steve Buttleman, Official Bugler of Churchill Downs and the Kentucky Derby, playing the Call to the Post. The Gathering theme was "Arise, shine, your light has come!" (Isaiah 6:1)

Mission Tour: Before the opening, the group took a Louisville Mission Tour. Presbyterian Women gave \$200,000 through its Birthday Offering in 2006-2007 to the Kentucky Refugee Ministries (KRM), a group that advocates for and provides resettlement services to refugees. From job placement to citizenship classes, KRM programs support individuals in their journey to rebuild their lives with a sense of hope and belonging. We felt that our money was well-spent! We also visited a Community Supported Agriculture program that offers garden plots, environmental education, and agriculture training to help provide food security and income generation.

*Workshops:* Besides morning and evening plenaries with wonderful speakers, women could choose from 41 workshops. Some of the main topics were immigration, human trafficking, racial equity, and violence toward women.

Discussion Groups: There were also book discussion groups. Have you read Small Great Things, Change of Heart, or Stranger in Their Own Land? The writers of the next three years of HORIZON Bible studies spoke about their themes.

**Herbert Nelson**, stated clerk for PCUSA, explained the state of the church:

The mission field is at our doorstep. We need young people.

There will be new worshiping communities.

Like our Sudanese congregation, there will be churches within churches, with ethnic groups practicing their Presbyterian faith in their own language and using their own traditions. We need to grow disciples by making the Gospel visible and showing that Jesus is alive and operative in our lives. Don't be private—tell the story. Invite someone to church.

The luncheon for Synod of Lakes and Prairies women gave us an opportunity for fellowship with women from our six state area: MN, WI, NE, IA, SD, and ND. Our international guest was **Nora Palma**, vice-presidente de Presbiterial de Mujeres de Honduras.

A *peace and justice march* addressed the lingering effects of racism and the discriminatory practice of redlining that have resulted in segregation. Before the march we heard from the mayor of Louisville, Greg Fischer, who outlined the progress the city has made and urged the attendees to ask for change in their cities.


