

is the greatest hymn of all time? That's an interesting question, with many wonderful candidates.

This past summer The Hymn Society arranged a March Madness style bracketed tournament to determine the Greatest Hymn of All Time – not as a definitive verdict but just as something meant for a bit of fun. The results were very interesting. The Elite 8 came down to:

"Holy, Holy, Holy"

"Be Thou My Vision"

"O Come, All Ye Faithful"

"My Hope Is Built on Nothing Less"

"O Come, O Come Emmanuel"

"Of the Father's Love Begotten"

"Holy God, We Praise Your Name"

"How Great Thou Art"

In the final voting in mid-July, about 800 members of the 1200-member Hymn Society voted "Holy, Holy, Holy" as the Greatest Hymn of All Time. I'm sure you could quibble with the results (personally, one of my favorites, "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing" didn't even make the Elite 8), but all in all, I love every hymn on that list and the winner is certainly deserving.

Stop the hopping

A church is an imperfect mix of imperfect believers, so it's easy for members to find faults or feel disappointed. That, in turn, may tempt us to shop around.

C.S. Lewis addresses that in The Screwtape Letters. "If a man can't be cured of churchgoing," Screwtape advises his demon protégé, "the next best thing is to send him all over the neighborhood looking for the church that 'suits' him until he becomes a taster or connoisseur of churches." How Satan must hate when Christians maintain long-term commitment to one church!

The urge to church-hop harms congregations as well as believers. "Spiritual depth isn't fostered by satiating your sense of felt needs," writes James Emery White. "It's receiving a balanced diet of teaching and challenge, investing in service and mission, living in community and diversity that you probably would not select for yourself."

Committee disburses funds to local organizations

Just do it!

September: Atrial Fibrillation Awareness Month

"Afib," as medical personnel often call atrial fibrillation, occurs when the electrical conduction in someone's heart becomes disorganized, causing rapid irregular contractions of the atrial (the upper chamber of the heart).

Some people have no symptoms; others feel palpitations or weakness. Afib increases the risk of stroke five times so it is important to monitor and treat.

- Check your pulse or get your pulse checked, especially if you are feeling palpitations.
- 2. If atrial fibrillation is suspected, get appropriate follow up tests including an EKG.
- 3. If you have afib, get appropriate treatment to get the heart back in rhythm whether through medication or shock therapy. Sometimes surgery may be indicated. After the heart returns to rhythm, new medications may be added and titrated to keep it in rhythm.
- If you have afib, prevent blood clots by taking your blood-thinners.
- 5. Watch for strokes remembering the acronym FAST (Face - drooping, paralysis and sometimes vision loss on one side, Arms - loss of strength on one side, Speech - slurred or disorganized speech, Time - get emergency treatment immediately!)


