Stewardship 2017: Faithful Stewardship: with much, with little, with all. Our ability to accomplish our goal depends on the generous financial support of the congregation. To date we have received 207 pledges for \$668,255 toward our goal of \$714,734 in pledges, leaving a gap of \$46,479.

The Synod of Lakes and Prairies publicly supports the Standing Rock Sioux tribe and the water protectors who have been protesting the Dakota Access Pipeline for several months. At our December meeting the Mission Committee of FPC approved a donation of \$500 to support the Standing Rock Sioux people in their protest. Money will be used for a legal defense fund as further action continues in 2017. Some FPC members have indicated an interest in supporting this cause.
