





Finding Stuff on FPC's Information Superhighway

How do I navigate the FPC Website?

Our webpage is located at: www.fpcrochester.org

The webpage opens to the homepage, which then includes links to multiple different "pages" within the site. You navigate to those pages by clicking on links. How to identify a link depends on your browser and equipment. For instance, from My computer display, I know there is a link exists when a little pointing hand pops up on my screen. On my Android phone display, there are different ways to identify where a link is located. Often I can just tap on a word in the text that will take me to the linked information

There is a red bar along the top of the web page that links to our FPC Youtube channel.

The Youtube channel is found at: FPC RochesterMN.

You will know you have landed at the right location if you see a thumbnail picture of the front entrance of the church.

When you are looking for recordings that are posted to our channel, click on the [LIVE] link under the FPC masthead. You will find the history of all the services that have streamed, as well as future services that are scheduled. Those future services won't be available until they are actively streaming or have streamed.
