DOM Search Committee names John Stender new Director of Music / Organist

Hello Fellow Parishioners:

Many of you may have already heard our good news, but perhaps a few have not. The Search Committee made a job offer to our top candidate, **John E. Stender**. We received a positive response from Mr. Stender regarding the offer and we hope to receive a signed contact from him in the very near future.

Mr. Stender holds a Master of Music degree in Sacred Music from Indiana University (Bloomington) and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music and Religion from Luther College (Decorah). Mr. Stender is currently the Director of Music at Parish Church of St. Helena (Beaufort, South Carolina), and has been there since August 2015. John and Sarah are the parents of a young son, **Daniel.**

We are still negotiating the appropriate start date for Mr. Stender, and we think he and his family will join us in worship during the last week of August. Mr. Stender's wife, Sarah Stender, is also a church musician (organist and choir director), and both are now in the process of informing their congregations about their pending move to Rochester.

Our Committee's work on this portion of the search process seems to have progressed as we hoped it would. Thanks for the support all of you gave us as we worked to find the right candidate for our position. I personally applaud **Karen Sessler** for doing the lion's share of the work to make all of this come together. She worked tirelessly doing a host of things for us as we moved through the process.

Karen, you are one of God's blessings to the church and our congregation! I have also appreciated the eager support from our other committee members, all of whom were eager to assist as needed to facilitate the search process (Christopher Boswell, Dee Tiedeman, Dwight Jennings, Jan Hosier, Jeremy Braun, Lettie Eckberg, T.J. Parlette).

During their visit you will have an opportunity to support the work of MN Adult and Teen Challenge through a free will offering. I hope you will come to hear about the work of God taking place right here in Rochester.

Who was the first person to teach you about Jesus? Who was the first person to show you how to honor God with your life? When did these things happen? For many of us, they happened during our childhood. They happened at home, Sunday School, church, camp, mission trips, and service experiences.

We don't need a study to tell us that a foundation of faith established during childhood and young adulthood helps ensure lifelong faith and service – but studies do show this to be true. Psalm 71 testifies to this same truth. Verse 17 says "O God, from my youth you have taught me, and I still proclaim your wondrous deeds." Truly, the patterns and lessons established during these formative years continue to bear fruit throughout a person's life.

That is why our congregation will join in support of the Pentecost Offering on June 9. This church-wide offering is used to encourage, develop, and support young people, as well as to address the needs of at-risk children. 40% of this special offering will be retained by First Presbyterian for ministry to children and young adults within our community and 60% will be used to support the ministry of the Presbyterian Mission Agency. Registration open for Synod Gathering of Presbyterian Women June 20–23


