Maybelle Pauline Krieger

96 years ago in May, Ole and Rae Mattson welcomed the arrival of their third daughter Maybelle to the family. Her two sisters Anita and Orpha greeted her too. Welcomed again in January of this year by all of them and her husband Harold G. of 46 years, although one could say 74 years, as Pauli didn't remarry, The Lord Jesus shepherded her home.

Growing up in rural North Dakota, a small but industrious town called New Rockford, she learned values that guided her entire life - among them generosity, compassion, and education. An incomplete list, but you get the idea. Pauli and Harold had four children of their own. Son Westscot and daughter Lisa were not born in Rochester, Minnesota, but most of their formative years were here. They shared them with young son Harold and youngest daughter Jean.

Pauli lived an active social and professional life. Following her graduation from St. Olaf College, Class of 1949, in Northfield, Minnesota, she began her career as an educator at Macalester College, where she met her future groom. After they settled in Rochester, Pauli continued by substitute teaching, sharing her interest and experience in subjects other than her fields of English and Music. One might think that would be enough for her, think again! She was a member of many organizations such as: ALA, AAUW, PEO, American Guild of Organists, Rochester Civic Music, Soldiers Field Memorial Committee to name but a few. She was always an influence in and, notably, President at the Regional or National level of some.

This brief overview of Pauli's life will suffice for print.
