

A Taste of Heaven

When an admirer asked renowned pianist Vladmir Horowitz how he could play so beautifully, he's said to have replied that anyone could play the notes, but the true music lay in the pauses between them. The same can be said of life.

Rabbi Evan Moffic (Shalom for the Heart) writes, "It is in the pauses — the rests, the spaces in between — that meaning is made and that holiness is felt." Nowadays we keep so busy there's hardly a pause or space in our day.

"But that's not the way God created us [or] the world," Moffic continues. "God worked, then rested. God created, then paused. ... Thus, our Sabbath is the day when we can marvel at the beauty of the world God created. It is the day we enjoy what the ancient sages called 'a taste of heaven.' It is a day when we stop thinking about the what of life and remind ourselves of the why of life,"

Need a ride to church? We're here to serve you!

Deacons underwrite cab service for members to attend church activities

Have you used the FPC van to get to Sunday worship or special services? Nothing could be easier! We hope you who no longer drive your car to church will consider this service a viable alternative.

For several years the Board of Deacons has offered a cab service to bring members to *ANY* activity at FPC, e.g. Sunday worship, Ash Wednesday or Maundy Thursday services, Festival of Music programs, Forums @First panel discussions, special fellowship events, or Circle activities.

To use this service you need a voucher available in the church office. You make your own arrangement with Med City Taxi and then give the voucher to the cab driver instead of cash. The cab company adds a tip when they bill us. For a round trip you will need two vouchers. Your Deacon caller would be happy to get some for you - just ask her or him.

You are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity to get to church the easy way, especially when winter sets in and driveways become icy and roads snowy.


